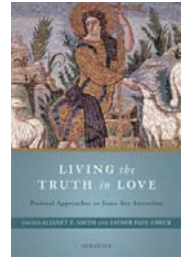

HOLY INNOCENTS' BOOKSHELF

Living the Truth in Love
Pastoral Approaches to Same-Sex Attraction
By: Father Paul Check

Living the Truth in Love grew out of the desire to provide answers to the questions posed for the Synod on Marriage called by Pope Francis:

- ..# How can the Christian community give pastoral attention to families with persons with same-sex attraction? While avoiding any unjust discrimination, how can the Church give such persons pastoral care in light of the Gospel?
- ..# How can God's will be proposed to them in their situation?

People who want to be instruments of Christ's love to those who experience same-sex attraction (SSA) seek guidance on how best to do so. They need to listen to the stories of those who experience SSA and the stories of those who have accompanied them on their journeys. They also need to ground their responses on a genuine Christian understanding of the human person and of human sexuality.

This volume includes essays that lay out the Christian view of the human person and of human sexuality, essays that challenge the bifurcation of sexualities into "heterosexual" and "homosexual". Topics include an explanation of the meaning of the word "disorder", a discussion of the therapeutic power of friendship, and an application of Saint John Paul II's personalism to the question of same-sex attraction. Psychologists and counselors explain various ways of affirming those who experience SSA and of leading them to experience the power of Christ's healing love. Several of those who experience SSA tell their touching and inspiring stories.

The Mass: Our School of Love

Your life as a lay person in the world is hard; and the life around you will be grim, even sordid. But God will give you strength. Everything can be borne between two Masses. Every morning you will eat the bread of the saints, and you will be able to face any kind of day. Your mind and heart will be nourished by the Word of God. The voice of the psalmist and the warm tones of the voice of Christ will give you courage and new hope. Your faith will be renewed. You plunge into the sea of fire that is the Mass and come out burning, ready to go forth and light fires of love, even in the most wretched slums of the city.

The Mass, above all, is the school of love, the love of God for us, and of us for God. Our faith centers around the Mass—and the immense and infinite thought I never tire of repeating—*that God loved us first*, and that all we have to do to be fiery Catholics, is *to love him back*.

Slowly, imperceptibly, daily Mass will bring us closer and closer to God and to Our Lady. Slowly too, it will teach us silence, so that through the day, as time goes by, we will realize that there is within us a garden enclosed and that we have the key to its hidden gate. We can go into it, and there meet our tremendous Lover, and like Mary Magdalene in Bethany, sit at his feet in the silence of love, while Martha, in us, goes about her manifold duties of the day.

BLESSED MARIE-LEONIE PARADIS - Feast Day: May 3rd

Virginie-Alodie Paradis was born on May 12, 1840, at L'Acadie, Quebec, a village near Montreal. Her parents, Joseph Paradis and Emilie Gregoire had six children, two of whom died as infants. Elodie (Alodie) was their third child and only daughter. She had three brothers: Joseph-Edouard, Emilien and Vital.

At an early age, she had a great desire for God and an attraction to the religious life. On February 27, 1854, when she was 14, she joined the Marianites of Holy Cross where she wished to devote herself to the service of priests. At the novitiate, she received the name of Sister Marie-de-Sainte-Leonie and after her profession on August 22, 1857, she was sent to teach. Her attraction to support the ministry of priests was very strong but only in 1874 was she able to realize her dream.

She was sent to Memramcook, New Brunswick, as superior of the sisters and to maintain the domestic management at Saint Joseph's College directed by Father Camille Lefebvre, a Holy Cross Father. After her arrival, many young Acadians presented themselves to become religious. They were poor and most of them did not speak English, and Sister Marie-de Sainte-Leonie had to send them to Indiana to make their novitiate. She asked to open a francophone novitiate in Acadia but this request was refused. Numerous Acadians wished to commit themselves to God and after a short time of formation were sent to serve in houses of education. The Institute of the Little Sisters of the Holy Family was officially recognized on May 31, 1880.

Because the Bishop of Saint John, New Brunswick, did not accept them as a new religious community in his diocese, for fear of having to support the sisters, Bishop Paul LaRocque of Sherbrooke, Quebec, welcomed them warmly in his diocese in 1895. Still a religious of Holy Cross, Mother Marie-Leonie was strongly advised to become a Little Sister of the Holy Family. Therefore, in 1905, she asked Rome to be released from her commitment toward her original community. She remained the Foundress and Superior General until her sudden death on May 3, 1912, at the age of 72.

In 1984, at the time of his visit to Canada, Pope John Paul II beatified Mother Marie-Leonie Paradis at Jarry Park, Montreal.

Quotes of Mother Marie-Leonie

"Let the torments of Jesus remain so profoundly engraved in my heart that I may never commit a single sin of my own volition."

"My sweet Jesus, you know that my greatest sorrow is that I do not love you at every instant of the day and night, you who are so good to me and so compassionate."

"My children, only in heaven shall we know the greatness of the priest and all that he has done for us. Therefore, pray for him every day, you must do so... If I ever heard one of you say a single word against the priest, I would be greatly saddened."

Prayer for the Glorification of Mother Marie Leonie

O Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph, who infused into the heart of the devout Mother Marie Leonie an ardent love for God and souls, and inspired her to dedicate the religious family which she founded to serve the clergy with a humble and generous devotion, deign to glorify your faithful servant, we beseech you, and grant her, in good time, the honors of glorification. Amen

Here, a candle is always lit in their memory. All day long people stop to pray. On the first Monday of every month, our 12:15pm Mass is celebrated in honor of these children and for the comfort of their families. We pray that you will find peace in knowing that your child(ren) will be remembered at the Shrine and honored by all who pray here.

We will inscribe the names of babies who have died before and at birth in our Book of Life, and as always, we invite you to visit the Shrine if you are in New York City.
